



## **Highfields Primary Academy SPORTS Premium**

The PE and Sport funding is an allocation of additional funding provided to school to fund improvements to the provision of PE and Sport, for the benefit of primary aged pupils to ensure that pupils develop healthy lifestyles and to raise standards of PE teaching and achieve sporting success.

## Proposed Spending Plan 2021- 2022

### **1) To increase engagement of PE and Sports activity**

Sports sessions at EDA targeted at inclusion of more reluctant participants in sport and physical activity.	£200	To increase engagement of reluctant pupils in sport. Introduce children to a wider range and more unusual sports.
Train appoint Play Leaders for KS1 lunchtimes	£500	To encourage KS1 pupils to be more active during lunchtimes
Half termly sporting challenge run by the sports council	£500	All children to participate in sports activities organised by the sports council

### **2) To raise the profile of Sport**

Invite a professional sports personality into school in preparation for the Commonwealth Games	£600	To give sport a high profile within the school community
Develop a sports council	£200	To give children a greater voice in the development of sport at Highfields.
Developing the role of pupil sports leaders who will champion and lead sporting activities for others within school	£250	To actively encourage children to take on the responsibility for leading others in sporting activity

### 3) Increased Competence of Staff in delivering PE and Sport

To appoint Aston Villa Foundation coaches to work alongside teaching staff to deliver PE and Games sessions, modelling and sharing good practice and supporting teaching staff in developing a range of skills.	£4000	To upskill teaching staff in multiple areas of the PE and Sport curriculum. Improving quality of teaching and learning within the PE curriculum

Multi- skills training (progressive sport)	£2000	To upskill staff to deliver multi sports throughout school
Training Lunchtime staff in sports skills	£750	To upskill lunchtime staff to encourage a more active lunchtime

Year 3 pupils to attend Elmhurst Ballet School as part of the Chance to Dance Project with the Royal Ballet	£350	An opportunity for the children to experience dancing alongside members of the Royal Ballet (opportunity to enhance the pupil's cultural capital in relation to Dance).
Easter School for Year 3 pupils – Royal Ballet. This is to be held in school and needs to be staffed by Highfields.	£400	Year 3 pupils have extended opportunity to participate in Ballet workshops
Transport to outdoor education centre	£600	To ensure children have access to the outdoor education provision and extend opportunities for participation in alternative sports.

Participate in School Games competitions: Eg: Football Cricket Rounders Netball	£500	Increase opportunities for interschool competitive sport
To train a member of staff in order to drive a minibus to take pupils to participate in competitive sporting events.	£300	To increase the opportunities for participating in a wider range of school to school competition
