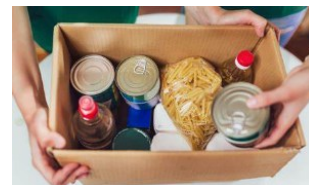
How To Access The Foodbank at Chase Terrace Academy
